



Missing woman traced within hours at RGIA

The RGIA Outpost of the Cyberabad Police on Saturday swiftly traced a missing woman passenger within hours of receiving a complaint, underscoring its commitment to prompt and people-centric policing at the international airport.

According to the RGIA police, the complainant, Nimesh Sarki, a chef by profession and a resident of Borabanda, Hyderabad, reported that his wife, Anju Chhetri, had travelled from Bagdogra Airport, Siliguri, West Bengal State, to the Rajiv Gandhi International Airport, Hyderabad. When she could not be contacted after the scheduled arrival and her mobile phone was found switched off, the complainant made enquiries at the airport and, unable to trace her whereabouts, lodged a missing person petition at the RGIA OP police station.

Treating the matter with utmost seriousness, the RGIA Outpost staff immediately constituted a special team and undertook meticulous efforts to trace the missing woman. Passenger movement was analysed and relevant logistical and technical inputs were gathered. During the course of investigation, the team identified a cab booked by the woman after her arrival. The cab driver was contacted and, based on the drop location provided, the police team proceeded to the area and gathered crucial leads.

Based on these leads, the police team successfully traced the missing woman within a few hours of registration of the case and ensured her safety, bringing relief to her family.

The complainant expressed his gratitude and appreciation for the swift response and dedicated efforts of the SHO and the entire RGIA Airport Police team.
