

## Collective Efforts Ensure Peaceful Ganesh Immersion: Cyberabad CP



The Cyberabad Police meticulously planned the Ganesh festival, beginning with an inter-departmental coordination meeting involving all stakeholders. The festival, held from 27.08.2025 to 06.09.2025, was conducted smoothly and peacefully across the Cyberabad jurisdiction, thanks to foolproof arrangements.

Senior officers closely monitored ground-level bandobast arrangements on daily basis. Senior officers supervised the processions in real-time from the Public Safety Integrated Operations Centre (PSIOC), ensuring swift responses to any situation.



For Ganesh immersion, the following elaborate arrangements were made by the Cyberabad Police Commissionerate to ensure the smooth conduct of the festival:

- Approximately 88,182 idols were immersed across the Cyberabad limits, including 16,309 in Madhapur Zone, 26,542 in Balanagar Zone, 23,952 in Medchal Zone, 18,308 in Rajendranagar Zone, and 3,071 in Shamshabad Zone. Around 490 idols were immersed at Hussain Sagar, Tank Bund. Among these, nearly 28,000 idols were three feet and above in height.
- There are 33 major lakes/tanks in the Cyberabad Commissionerate—20 in Ranga Reddy District, 12 in Medchal-Malkajgiri District, and 1 in Sangareddy District. Of these, 25 lakes under GHMC limits were placed under CCTV surveillance.
- Well-trained officers with prior experience were deployed for bandobust duties, including a total of 5,785 personnel (including 568 from outside forces), along with special SHE teams.
- Around 65 static and mobile cranes were deployed.

- Anti-sabotage checks were conducted to secure the procession routes and side lanes leading to immersion points.
- The entire immersion process was monitored via CCTV cameras from the PSIOC building, O/o CP, Cyberabad, Gachibowli.

The Commissioner credited the peaceful conclusion of the immersion to the coordinated efforts of Cyberabad Police, GHMC, TGSPDCL, R&B, TRANSCO, Transport, Irrigation, Fire Services, Health, and other departments. He also acknowledged the contributions of the Bhagyanagar Ganesh Utsav Samithi (BGUS), media, and the public for maintaining harmony throughout the festival.
